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

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



About Varun Shipping Company

Mr. Yudhishthir Khatau, the Promoter, Chairman & Managing Director of the Group is a well-known and respected person in the Shipping Industry. He has been the past President of the Indian National Shipowners' Association at a young age of 37, where he distinguished himself with the development of the Tonnage Tax Code that now provides the fiscal regime for Indian shipping. He has also been the first Indian and the youngest President of the Baltic & International Maritime Council (BIMCO). the 106 year old, most influential and effective shipping industry association in the world, which is headquartered in Denmark.

Varun's presence in the Indian LPG trade has provided tremendous "infrastructure" in terms of maritime logistics to the Indian PSUs namely Indian Oil

Corporation Limited (IOCL), Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) and Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), who import LPG from the Middle East Region. Without India's national fleet mainly represented by the Varun Group, the country would have to depend largely on foreign flag vessels to transport this crucial cargo that is the lifeblood to India.

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
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




SCIATICA: THE NERVE PINCHING ANOMALY

What is sciatica?

Sciatica is pain in the lower extremity resulting from irritation of the sciatic nerve. The pain of sciatica is typically felt from the low back (lumbar area) to behind the thigh and can radiate down below the knee. The sciatic nerve is the largest nerve in the body and begins from nerve roots in the lumbar spinal cord in the low back and extends through the buttock area to send nerve endings down the lower limb. The pain of sciatica is sometimes referred to as sciatic nerve pain.



What are causes of Sciatica?

Sciatica might be a symptom of a "pinched nerve" affecting one or more of the lower spinal nerves. The nerve might be pinched inside or outside of the spinal canal as it passes into the leg

Conditions that cause Sciatica:

- A herniated or slipped disc that causes pressure on a nerve root—
 This is the most common cause of sciatica.
- Piriformis syndrome This develops when the piriformis muscle, a small muscle that lies deep in the buttocks, becomes tight or spasms, which can put pressure on and irritate the scratic nerve.
- Spinal stenosis This condition results from narrowing of the spinal canal with pressure on the nerves.
- Spondylolisthesis This is a slippage of one vertebra so that it is out of line with the one above it, narrowing the opening through which the nerve exits

Aside from a pinched nerve from a disc, other causes of sciatica include irritation of the nerve from adjacent bone, tumors, muscle, internal bleeding, infections in or around the lumbar spine, injury, and other causes. Sometimes sciatica can occur because of irritation of the sciatic nerve during pregnancy.

What are sciatica symptoms?

Sciatica causes pain, a burning sensation, numbress, or tingling radiating from the lower back and upper buttock down the back of the thigh to the back of the leg. The result is lumbar pain, buttock pain, hip pain, and leg pain. Sometimes the pain radiates around the hip or buttock to feel like hip pain. While sciatica is often associated with lower back pain (lumbago) it can be present without low back pain. Severe sciatica can make walking difficult if not impossible. Sometimes the symptoms of sciatica are aggravated by walking or bending at the waist and relieved by lying down. The pain relief by changing positions can be partial or complete.

How do health-care professionals diagnose Sciatica?

A complete medical history, including a review of your symptoms, and a physical exam can help the health care provider diagnose sciatica and determine its cause. For example, he or she might perform a straight leg-raise test, in which you lie on your back with your legs straight. The health care provider will slowly raise each leg and note the elevation at which your pain begins. This test can help pinpoint the affected nerves and determine if there is a problem with one of your discs.

Other diagnostic tests might be performed to look for other causes of sciatic pain. Depending on what your health care provider finds, he or she might recommend further testing. Such testing might include:

- X-ray to look for fractures in the spine.
- Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) or computed tomography (CT) scan to create images of the structures of the back
- Nerve conduction velocity studies/electromyography to examine how well electrical impulses travel through the sciatic nerve
- Myelogram using dye injected between the vertebrae to determine if a vertebra or disc is causing the pain

However, most patients with sciatica can be treated without the need for further diagnostic testing.

What are treatment options for Sciatica?

The goal of treatment is to decrease pain and increase mobility. Treatment most often includes rest (on a firm mattress or on the floor), physical therapy, and the use of medicine to treat pain and inflammation. A customized physical therapy exercise program might be developed.

Medicine — Pain medicines and anti-inflammatory drugs help to relieve pain and stiffness, allowing for increased mobility and exercise. There are many common over-the-counter medicines called non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs). They include aspirin, ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil), and naproxen (Naprosyn, Aleve).

Muscle relaxants, such as cyclobenzaprine (Flexeril), might be prescribed to relieve the discomfort associated with muscle spasms. However, these medicines might cause confusion in older people. Depending on the level of pain, prescription pain medicines might be used in the initial period of treatment.

Physical therapy — The goal of physical therapy is to find exercise movements that decrease sciatic pain by reducing pressure on the nerve. A program of exercise often includes stretching exercises to improve flexibility of tight muscles and aerobic exercise, such as walking.

The therapist might also recommend exercises to strengthen the muscles of your back, abdomen, and legs.

Spinal injections — An injection of a cortisone-like antiinflammatory medicine into the lower back might help reduce swelling and inflammation of the nerve roots, allowing for increased mobility.

Surgery — Surgery might be needed for people who do not respond to conservative treatment, who have progressing symptoms, and are experiencing severe pain.

Surgical options include:

- Microdiscectomy This is a procedure used to remove fragments of a hermiated disc.
- Laminectomy The bone that curves around and covers the spinal cord (lamina), and the tissue that is causing pressure on the sciatic nerve are removed.

Many people believe that yoga or acupuncture can improve sciatica. Massage might help muscle spasms that often occur along with sciatica. Biofeedback is an option to help manage pain and relieve stress, which can affect your ability to cope with pain. These are referred to as alternative therapies.

How long does Sciatica last?

The duration of sciatica is critically dependent on its cause. A dise herniation, back sprain, shingles, and degenerative lumbar spine can all cause temporary forms of sciatica, lasting from days to weeks. Each can also cause chronic sciatica. Sometimes degeneration of the lumbar spine and discs can cause chronic sciatica that persists unless a surgical intervention is performed.

Are there home remedies and exercises for Sciatica?

Keys to the management of acute sciatica include relief of pain and relaxing associated muscle spasms. Home remedies include heat and cold pack topical administration, over-the-counter pain medications such as acetaminophen (Tylenol), naproxen (Aleve), ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin), and aspirin, and gradual exercises and stretching. Exercises and stretching can sometimes best be guided by physical therapists.

Preventing Sciatica?

Some sources of sciatica are not preventable, such as degenerative disc disease, back strain due to pregnancy, and accidental falls.

Although it might not be possible to prevent all cases of sciatica, you can take steps to protect your back and reduce your risk.

Practice proper lifting techniques. Lift with your back straight, bringing yourself up with your hips and legs, and holding the object close to your chest. Use this technique for lifting everything, no matter how light.

- · Avoid/ stop cigarette smoking, which promotes disc degeneration.
- Exercise regularly to strengthen the muscles of your back and abdomen, which work to support your spine.
- Use good posture when sitting, standing, and sleeping.

Good posture helps to relieve the pressure on your lower back.

Avoid sitting for long periods.

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

Visa


A Pakistani couple trying to flee their country in search of a better, safer life is what this short film is all about. It highlights the plight of

LEGAL ASPECTS OF HANDLING MARINE INSURANCE CLAIMS

(In continuation to earlier article of 1st October, 17 edition)

Anghelators V. Northern Assurance Co (The Olympia) (1924) 19 Ll. L. Rep. 255, per Loard Bikenhead at pp. 256 - 257.

"The circumstances of the war led to a very great inflation of the value of all kinds of tonnage. The year which immediately followed maintained those high prices. The later years which followed were marked by an equally rapid deterioration in the value of every kind of tonnage. The result has been evident in other branches of our life, and not less evident in the law Courts, for there have come before the Courts a series of cases in which the allegation has been made that persons have willfully destroyed, or in the current expression, scuttled their ships, having previously taken the precaution to insure in order that they might receive, instead of a valueless ship, the price of that ship as appraised at the period of highest inflation."

Features common to cases of this kind:

- -financial loss in the shipping operation
- losses in similar incidents and suspicious circumstances where the assured had sinister motives: water coming into the ship from some undiscovered cause, fine weather, a comfortable distance from shore, boats easily launched, and the crew safely landed after a pleasant night's sail.

In the Gold Sky [1972] 2 Lloyd's Rep. 187, the Court accepted evidence from the salvage tug, whose offer of assistance was declined by the third engineer and the master it was evident that both wished their ship to sink and deliberately kept the salvors off so that she might sink, giving rise to the inference that the entry of sea water was not fortuitous and they so acted in accordance with the plaintiffs' general instructions. It was held that although the insurers had not proved beyond reasonable doubt that the ship was scuttled, the plaintiffs had not discharged the burden upon them of proving, on balance of probabilities that the loss of their ship was fortuitous, and therefore their claim failed.

If the court is left in doubt as to the real cause of the loss after examination of the evidence, the end outcome is that the assured has failed to prove its case "on balance of probabilities."

"A judge confronted with two rival theories both of which he regards as extremely improbable, or one of which he regards as improbable and the other of which is virtually impossible, should carefully bear in mind and consider carefully in his judgment that the third alternative, namely that the evidence leaves him in doubt as to the cause of the aperture in the ship's hull which admits into her sufficient water to make her sink, and that in those circumstances the assured has failed to discharge the burden of proof which is on them:" the Popo M [1985] 2 Lloyd's Rep.1.

There, the insured ship as a whole and the shell-plating in particulars were in a wasted condition. During a voyage through the Mediterranean the ship sank in good weather and calm seas as the result of water entering through large hole in the shell-plating and flooding the engine-room and two after holds. The assured contended that the proximate cause was a collision with a submerged submarine, to which the underwriters countered that the prolonged wear and tear of the hull resulted in the shell-plating opening up under the ordinary action of wind and waves without any collision. The ship could not be examined because she had sunk in deep water. The House of Lords held that where an assured alleged total loss by a peril of the sea, the burden of proving that such peril (collision with a submerged submarine) was the real cause of the loss was in the entire process on the assured, even if the insurers chose to advance another explanation for the loss dependent on an exclusion clause (ie wear and tear; sinking in the face of calm weather and seas). Once it had been shown that the ship had been sunk through water entering through her shell-plating, the burden of proof had been on the assured to show with particularity what peril of the seas (which was to be relied upon) could be demonstrated to have created the hole. Where the court found two theories put forward as the proximate causes of the loss-that one preferred by the insurers as virtually impossible-and the other by the assured as extremely improbable- the court would not be justify in drawing the inference in favour of a loss by perils of the sea. The correct conclusion would be that the true cause was in doubt, and that therefore the assured had failed to discharge the burden of proof placed on them.

- In ordinary circumstances an insurer who wishes to rely on an exception clause must prove that the loss is due to an excepted peril.
- Where the insurer disputes liability on the policy on the ground of a breach of the warranty, the onus is on the insurer.
- The court may also draw inference from overwhelming evidence pointing on way, especially where it is absolutely and totally deprived of any possible alternative facts which could counter such evidence: Macbeth v. King (1916) 115 LT 221. There the ship was insured against "all perils of the seas, loss in consequences of hostilities and warlike operations excepted." The ship was on a voyage and was never seen again after the pilot disembarked. In view of the fact that the seas in which she was sailing were rendered dangerous owing to mines from English minefield having got adrift, or the presence of German mines or submarines, the court drew the inference that the ship was lost in consequence of the exempted peril.



The primary topics covered during the sessions were the basics of IMDG Code and its 38th Amendment. IMDG code lays down the regulations for transportation. of Dangerous Goods in collaboration with MARPOL and SOLAS. STCW-also lays down the requirement of training for handling Dangerous Goods. The objective of IMDG Code is "to enhance the safe carriage of dangerous goods while facilitating the free unrestricted movement of such goods".

Mr. Kallada explained the basic process for transportation of dangerous goods, as stated by IMDG Code which is as follows:

- Classification
- 2. Packing, marking & labelling
- 3. Containerization
- 4. Placing placards
- 5. Documentation
- Haulage
- Destuffing and removal of placards.

He also highlighted the fact that the stevedores and other employees of shore side have to mandatorily undergo 4 types of training -General Awareness, Function Specific, Security and Safety.

and Chief Executive Officer Capt. Harjit Singh.

The speaker brought to light the point of using appropriate legal terms in the IMDG Code and

also knowing the meaning of each. For e.g. the word 'Shall' means the regulations stated are 'Mandatory', 'Should' means it is 'Recommendatory' and 'May' means it is 'Optional'.

During the sessions, the different classes of Dangerous Goods were also discussed at length. They are as follows:

- · Class 1-Explosives
- · Class 2-Gases
- Class 3-Flammable Liquids
- · Class 4-Flammable Solids
- Class 5-Oxidizing substances & organic peroxides

and infectious substances

- . Class 7-Radioactive substances
- . Class 8-Corrosive substances
- Class 9-Miscellaneous dangerous substances & environmentally hazardous.

These classes individually are further bifurcated into 3 groups based on the packing required for each goods.

Mr. Shashi stated that a master of the vessel must accept the cargo only if they abide by the IMDG Code. If the master accepts any non-abiding cargo, the port authorities have the right to penalize the master of the vessel.

Various other topics covered during the two-day sessions are:

- · Marking and placarding of containers and
- Segregation inside containers
- · Limited and expected quantities
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This session saw a unique phase of holding an examination for the attendees after the customary Question & Answer Round, The examination was conducted to know the level of understanding of topics discussed among the attendees.

Post the sessions, the attendees were handed-out certificates of participation as an acknowledgment of being present. A concluding note was presented by the Master of CMMI Capt. Philip Mathews.

It is hoped that this sustained efforts by CMMI of conducting such classes proves to be highly beneficial to the professionals who get to enhance their learnings and understandings on various topics. SEAANDJOB

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

NEWS UPDATE FOR ONBOARD CREW

CUT GST FOR RESTAURANTS, SMALL BUSINESSES: PANEL



panel of state finance ministers suggested fresh changes to the Goods and Services Tax (GST), including a cut in the levy at restaurants and a flat 1% tax for small traders, manufacturers and eateries that opt for the less onerous composition scheme.

According to sources the panel of five state finance ministers has suggested a flat 12% GST for standalone restaurants, whether airconditioned or not, and an 18% levy at eating joints located inside hotels. While standalone restaurants will not enjoy the benefit of input tax credit, those with 18% tax will be entitled to take credit for taxes paid by their suppliers.

Currently, restaurants frequented by the middle class face 18% CST.

While the overall incidence was expected to be lower with the gains of input tax credit eaten up by the restaurants, the levy is seen to be detrimental for consumers. The respite on composition scheme will also lower the burden for smaller eateries, which currently attract 5% tax under composition scheme.

The scheme, which also applies to traders and manufacturers with annual turnover of Rs. 20 lakh to Rs. 1 crore, comes with a flat rate of tax and a much lower compliance burden where only the sales details have to be disclosed with no requirement to file detailed returns with invoices. In addition, the returns have to be filed on a quarterly basis.

Unlike restaurants, the tax burden on traders (1%) and manufacturers (2%) is lower.

For traders, there will be two options. Those who are willing to pay tax on their total turnover, which includes revenue from the sale of exempted goods (such as unbranded flour or dal) and non-exempted items, will pay 0.5%. But those who take the pains to segregate income from the non-exempted products will have to pay 1% tax on the sale of these goods.

While a final decision will be taken by the GST Council, comprising union and state FMs, early November 2017, the move by the panel is seen to be another attempt to assuage small businesses which have been complaining bitterly about GST as many of them were out of the tax net till the new regime kicked in on July 1.

The group of ministers comprising finance ministers Hemanta Biswa Sarma (Assam), Sushil Modi (Bihar), Haseeb Drabu (J&K), Manpreet Badal (Punjab) and Amar Aggarwal (Chattisgarh) has also suggested that the composition scheme be extended to interstate sale of goods and services but no input tax credit will be available as was suggested by some states.

CATALONIA DECLARES INDEPENDENCE AS SPAIN PREPARES TO IMPOSE DIRECT RULE

atalonia declared independence from Spain less than an hour before a vote in the country's Senate gave Madrid the power to seize the region's autonomous powers.

The vote in the regional parliament followed a tense week of lastditch negotiations between Madrid and Barcelona. Seventy of 135 Catalan deputies voted for independence, with 10 opposed and two blank ballot slips.

Opposition lawmakers had walked out of the chamber ahead of the vote in protest. Rounds of applause broke out in the chamber as members of the parliament hugged and shook hands.

Thousands of people watched the voting process and the counting live on big screens outside Catalonia's parliament in Barcelona, and cheered and danced after the motion was passed. The motion calls for beginning of independence process that includes drafting Catalonia's new top laws and opening negotiations "on equal footing" with Spanish authorities to establish co-operation.

Catalan president Carles Puigdemont had ruled out calling a snap election, thought to have been a potential way of defusing tension with the central government.

Mr. Puigdement said he had not received sufficient guarantees that Madrid would hold off on its attempts to take control of the region.

Spain's Prime Minister, Mariano Rajoy, tweeted immediately after the vote calling for calm. He said the rule of law would be restored in Catalonia.

Spain's senate voted shortly after the Catalan independence vote,

to trigger Article 155 of the constitution and allow the imposition of direct rule. The vote will give Madrid the authority to govern Catalonia in the first direct intervention by central authorities in the affairs of one of the country's 17 autonomous areas.

Mr. Rajoy will have the power to sack Mr Puigdemont and his cabinet among other measures. Mr. Rajoy is understood to be planning immediately to enact the Article 155 provisions during an urgent meeting.

The crisis stems from an independence referendum, held earlier in October 2017, that Spanish judges had declared unconstitutional. Before it went ahead Madrid authorities confiscated ballot papers and closed polling stations, with clashes erupting in the streets.

An overwhelming majority of those who did vote favoured secession, but turnout was low and there is a substantial section of the Catalan population that wants to remain a part of Spain.

Following the independence vote, European Council president Donald Tusk said "nothing changes" for the EU, adding it would continue only to deal with the Madrid government.

Mr. Tusk urged Spain to favour "force of argument, not argument of force" in addressing the independence declaration.

The United States said Catalonia was an "integral part of Spain" and that it supported Spanish government efforts to keep the nation "strong and united."

State Department spokeswoman Heather Nauert said the two NATO allies "cooperate closely to advance our shared security and economic priorities."

WILL NOT ROLLBACK GST, BUT OPEN TO INCORPORATE CHANGES: PM MODI

Faced with the Opposition's criticism of demonetisation and GST, Prime Minister Narendra Modi struck a defiant note saying he was prepared to pay any price but won't take his foot off the reforms pedal.

"The government would make changes to better the system, and whether we remain or not, we will not let the nation be ruined," Modi said. "There would be no rollback of the mega reform move," Modi said, and slammed the Congress saying that the previous UPA government was only familiar with "atkana" (creating hurdles), "latkana" (dragging) and "bhatkana" (misdirecting) the people.

Modi's remarks came against the backdrop of the Opposition plan to raise the political ante over demonetization and GST, and leverage unrest in certain quarters over the twin measures as a stick to beat BJP with in Gujarat elections.

His comments were the second refutation of the speculation in certain quarters that criticism of GST had pushed the PM on the back foot, and that he would try to scatter the authorship of the reform across the political spectrum.

Congress has already declared it would hold protest on the anniversary of demonetization on November 8, 2017. The BJP, taking cue from PM, has said it would celebrate the anniversary of demonetization as anti-black money day.

Modi also said implementation of GST was a collective decision of all political parties and was largely accepted by the business community.

"There are some errors that need to be rectified and we are open about it," he said. "We are open to incorporate suggestions and make changes to better the system."

Modi said the business community was gradually accepting the move. "Earlier, many businessmen used to transact without receipts and accounts. Now they are realizing that it was wrong and are thinking in the interest of the nation," he said.

The PM allayed fears of the business community about a hike in taxes and said: "Some babus are threatening to enhance the tax in the coming years and reopening their old transactions. I assure the business fraternity that no officer will open their old registers..."

He also launched a veifed but scathing attack on Congress over corruption in development funds, asking which was the 'hand' that reduced every rupee of government money to 15 paise before it reached the beneficiary. Modi took a dig at the opposition for the party's criticism of demonetisation. Without naming Rajiv Gandhi, he recalled that a former PM had said that from every rupee sanctioned by the government, only 15 paise reached its beneficiary in a village.

overnment will bring in a new law to crack down on misleading advertisements and set up a central authority to fast-track redressal of consumers' grievances, said Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

The proposed law, awaiting Cabinet approval, provides for fine up to Rs. 50 lakh and up to three years' ban in case of misleading endorsement by celebrities while manufacturers would face fine and jail term for similar offence.

Addressing an international conference on consumer protection, the PM indicated that the government would introduce the law, which has been in the works for more than three years, during the winter session of Parliament.

"We are in the process of enacting a new Consumer Protection Act keeping in view business practices and requirements of the country. The proposed act lays great emphasis on consumer empowerment", the PM said. "Stringent provisions are proposed against misleading advertisements. A Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) with executive powers will be constituted for quick remedial action", he said.

Sources learnt that CCPA will be the first ever executive authority to take care of consumers' interests. While individual consumer complaints can be taken to the consumer commission, CCPA will have the power to initiate class action against a product or service, if it impacts a group or large section of consumers.

"We are changing the law to simplify the process of grievance redressal and for faster resolution. Consumers will be able to file cases in consumer commissions online and from the place of their residence rather than from the place of purchase," consumer affairs minister Ram Vilas Paswan said. The PM said the proposed law lays great emphasis on consumer empowerment. "Protection of consumer interests is a priority of the government. This is also reflected in our resolution of the New India. Moving beyond consumer protection, new India will have best consumer practices and consumer prosperity", Modi said.

THE WORLD'S 1" ROBOT CITIZEN-SOPHIA

Saudi Arabia has become the first country to give a robot citizenship. The move is an attempt to promote Saudi Arabia as a place to develop artificial intelligence - and, presumably, allow it to become a full citizen. But many pointed out that those same rights aren't afforded to many humans in the country.

The robot, named Sophia, was confirmed as a Saudi citizen during an event in Riyadh, said an official Saudi press release. "We just learnt, Sophia; I hope you're listening to me, you have been given the first Saudi citizenship for a robot," said panel moderator and business writer Andrew Ross Sorkin.

The robot then thanked the country and the event. "Thank you to the kingdom of Saudi Arabia. I am very honoured and proud for this unique distinction," Sophia told the panel. "It is historic to be the first robot in the world to be recognized with citizenship."

A number of web users pointed out that while the country might be celebrating the rights it has given to female-appearing robots, it still only gives limited rights to human women. A joke about Sophia asking to drop the system under which every woman must have a male guardian has been shared a third as many times as a popular one about the news, said the Sources.

YOUR FRIENDLY NEIGHBOURHOOD BANK BRANCH MAY SOON GO MISSING AND THIS COULD BE THE REASON WHY

oing to bank, a routine business chore, will soon become part of history, and so will the long queues, vouchers, pins and blue stamps. Banking as you know it is on its way out. Increasingly, banks are setting up digital branches as customers find transacting with machines easier and quicker.

India's largest lender, the State Bank of India (SBI), has taken the lead among public sector banks to experiment with digital branches through its offering SBI InTouch.

The bank now has over 250 such branches which facilitate instant opening of accounts, printing and issue of personalized debit cards, and also offers expert advice on investments through video conference. Another state-run lender, Bank of Baroda, is currently experimenting on a similar format.

Traditional jobs such as passbook updating, cash deposit, verification of know-your-customer details, salary uploads are going digital, increasing job redundancies. After the private-sector banks, even those in the public sector are trying robotics to centralize operations and hasten turnarounds which reduces the need for manual workers.

Soon after, HDFC Bank launched an electronic virtual assistant (EVA) a few months ago, State Bank of India (SBI), India's biggest public sector bank, too is testing a chatbot to handle customer queries and explain to them retail products and services. SBI Intelligent Assistant, SIA, might also be a modest beginning that can emerge as a wide phenomenon a few years later. In future, SIA might handle real banking transactions as well.

Branch banking, which just 15 years ago was the only channel, is now the preferred source of day-to-day transaction for very few of urban netizens. Forty per cent of the respondent prefer bank websites to branches for routine transactions as against merely 10% who go to the branch for routine transactions. 20% prefer mobile apps while 17% and 10% prefer SMS and ATMs, respectively.

60% respondents prefer digital banking, a reality which was unimaginable just five years ago. The penetration of digital banking has gone deeper than just big cities. Even in small towns with less than five lake population, 38% prefer to go to the website for routine transactions while only 11% go to the branch.

Banks are realizing that branch network is not the only means of reaching out to the customer. New age channels like internet, mobile banking and digital wallets are creating new ways to bank. The governments thrust to bring in the non-banked into the banking sphere and its push to prioritize digital transactions have changed the whole paradigm of traditional banking.

DEFENCE MINISTER NIRMALA SITHARAMAN SAYS NAVY INFRA TO IMPROVE SOON

efence Minister Nirmala Sitharaman took note of the "critical capability shortfalls" of the Indian Navy in regard to multi-role helicopters, conventional submarines and mine counter-measure vessels and assured the force of redressing these issues.

Sitharaman addressed the naval leadership at the Naval Commanders' Conference, held in Delhi on 24th-27th October, 2017. This is the second edition of this years bi-annual Naval Commanders' Conference.

"She (Sitharaman) took note of the critical capability shortfalls that the Navy is facing in ship-borne multi-role helicopters, conventional submarines and mine counter measure vessels, which need urgent redressal to maintain the combat edge of the Navy.

The Raksha Mantri assured the Commanders that these issues were being given due impetus and efforts were in hand to mitigate these shortcomings at the earliest," reads a Defence Ministry statement.

PPF ACCOUNT TO BE CLOSED IF HOLDER BECOMES NRI

A mending rules on post office savings schemes like the National Savings Certificates (NSC) and Public Provident Fund (PPF), the government has notified that such accounts would be closed prior to maturity in case of holders changing their personal status to become non-resident Indians (NRIs).

The amended rules were notified in the official gazette earlier this month.

The amendment to the PPF Scheme, 1968, says: "If a resident who opened an account under this scheme, subsequently becomes a non-resident during the currency of the maturity period, the account shall be deemed to be closed with effect from the day he becomes non-resident".

The interest payable would be up to the date of the account closure, it said.

A separate notification on NSCs said in case of a similar change of status of the certificate holder before the maturity period, "the certificate will be encashed, or deemed to be encashed on the day he becomes non-resident" and interest will be paid accordingly.

NRIs are not allowed in instruments like the National Savings Certificates, Public Provident Fund, Monthly Income Schemes and other time deposits offered by the post office.

Last month, the government had retained the interest rate on Public Provident Fund for October-December unchanged at 7.8%, in line with the rates for small savings schemes.

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

MSC RECEIVES UN AWARD FOR ELECTRONIC DATA EXCHANGE

SC Mediterranean Shipping Company, a leader in global transportation, is honoured to receive an award for its support of the United Nations global standard on electronic data exchange.

The award commends MSC's implementation of the data exchange language for transport, trade and logistics companies known by the acronym UN/EDIFACT.

Since its inception 30 years ago, UN/EDIFACT has become a reliable standard, helping companies to optimise communication and efficiencies throughout large, complex operations. Accepting the award at a ceremony in Rome, MSC's Chief Operating Officer Claudio Bozzo explained the importance of the standard, given the exchange of some 250 million messages per year between MSC and its fleet.

In one instance, when the container ship MSC Zoe arrived in the port of Antwerp, as many as 113,000 messages were exchanged during the discharge and loading of cargo.

MSC thanks the UN Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) for its work and looks forward to many more years of success in this field.

ECDIS NOT BEING USED AS ANTICIPATED

he U.K. Marine Accident Investigation Branch (MAIB) has announced that it is conducting a safety study, in collaboration with the Danish Maritime Accident Investigation Board, to understand why operators are not using ECDIS as envisaged by regulators and the system manufacturers.

The news follows the release of a MAIB investigation report into the grounding of the bulk carrier Muros. In the early hours of December 3, 2016, the Muros ran aground on Haisborough Sand, eight miles off the Norfolk coast.

When Muros grounded, she was following a passage plan shown on its electronic chart and display information system (ECDIS). The MAIB investigation found that:

- The vessel was following a planned track across Haisborough Sand. The passage plan in the ECDIS had been revised by the second officer less than three hours before the grounding and it had not been seen or approved by the master.
- A visual check of the track in the ECDIS using a small-scale chart did not identify it to be unsafe, and warnings of the dangers over Haisborough Sand that were automatically generated by the system's 'check route' function were ignored.
- The second officer monitored the vessel's position using the

ECDIS but did not take any action when the vessel crossed the 10meter safety contour into shallow water.

- The effectiveness of the second officer's performance was impacted upon by the time of day and a very low level of arousal, and she might have fallen as leep periodically.
- The disablement of the ECDIS alarms removed the system's barriers that could have alerted the second officer to the danger in time for successful avoiding action to be taken.

The MAIB has recently investigated several grounding incidents in which the way the vessels' ECDIS was configured and utilized was contributory. There is increasing evidence to suggest that first generation ECDIS systems were designed primarily to comply with the performance standards required by the IMO, as these systems became a mandatory requirement on ships, with insufficient attention being given to the needs of the end user, states the report.

"As a consequence, ECDIS systems are often not intuitive to use and lack the functionality needed to accommodate accurate passage planning in confined waters. This situation has led to seafarers using ECDIS in ways which are at variance with the instructions and guidance provided by the manufacturers and/or expected by regulators."

SHIPS CARRYING HIGH SULPHUR FUEL WITHOUT SCRUBBERS MAY BEAR THE BRUNT

rom 2020, a ship will have no legitimate reason to bunker fuel with more than 0.5% sulphur unless it has approved abatement technology or a valid exemption to trial such technology. The only other valid reason would be a situation where the ship could not obtain marine fuel with less than 0.5% sulphur because there was no availability in its bunkering port at the time.

But MARPOL Annex VI does not ban a ship from carrying high sulphur fuel oil (HSFO); it only regulates sulphur oxide (SOx) emissions which have to be met either through using low sulphur fuel or cleaning SOx out of the exhaust gas. As discussed at a recent IBIA forum, this leaves some doubts about how effectively MARPOL Annex VI can be enforced.

Signatories to MARPOL Annex VI can only take enforcement actions for non-compliance occurring within their territorial waters. If they have evidence that ships were using non-compliant fuel prior to entering their territorial waters, all they can do about that is to report it to the ship's flag State. It is then up to the flag State to ensure vessels flying their flag comply.

In February 2018, the 5th session of the International Maritime Organization's Sub-Committee on Pollution Prevention and

Response (PPR 5) is set to discuss measures to "promote consistent implementation of the 0.5% global sulphur limit" that takes effect from the start of 2020. There are plans to build on proposals, already discussed briefly at PPR 4 in January this year, to make enforcement simpler by introducing a ban on the carriage of high sulphur fuel oil (HSFO) as bunkers on ships without scrubbers.

IBIA presented a suite of proposals to PPR 4 regarding implementation of the 0.5% sulphur limit in 2020. Our submission included this paragraph: "It is already within the powers of PSCOs to enforce compliance within their coastal waters to ensure the coastal State is reaping the air quality benefits of the regulation. Should evidence emerge that implementation is uneven, measures to enhance more universal compliance may be considered, for example by making it an offence under the regulation for a ship to carry fuels above 0.5% sulphur unless that ship has approved alternative compliance methods installed, or a valid exemption."

Norway suggested to PPR 4 that the Sub-Committee should consider "a specific prohibition" to carry bunkers exceeding 0.5% sulphur right away, and intends to bring a more detailed proposal to PPR 5 in the hope of introducing a carriage-ban as soon as possible.

Concrete suggestions were not discussed in great detail at PPR 4 in January because the main task given to the Sub-Committee from the 70th session of the Marine Environment Protection Committee (MEPC 70) was to identify "justification and scope for a new output on what additional measures may be developed to promote consistent implementation of the 0.5% global sulphur limit". A "new output" means adding a new work item to the IMO's agenda, and can only be approved by the IMO's main Committees. PPR 4 developed the new output proposal and it was approved by MEPC 71, meaning PPR can now discuss and make recommendations to MEPC on concrete proposals.

A carriage ban on HSFO as bunkers for ships without valid exemptions could make it easier to enforce the global sulphur cap as this can be detected in port, either by document check or by sampling and analysis of the fuel oil. During PPR 4, one suggestion that came up took that idea a step further, namely to implement a ban both on the carriage and sales of HSFO to ships. This suggestion would, however, go beyond IMQ's remit.

Timing & legal perspective

It isn't clear yet how a carriage ban could be written into the

regulation. It would require changes to MARPOL Annex VI and this usually requires MEPC to specifically approve a "new output" to amend the regulation.

However, the scope for the "new output" on implementation of the 0.5% sulphur limit approved at MEPC 71 did include a paragraph to consider "any consequential regulatory amendments and/or guidelines necessary to address issues raised or otherwise considered necessary to ensure consistent implementation" so it might be allowed under this output.

In theory, if a regulatory change to introduce such a carriage ban was agreed at PPR 5, sent to MEPC 72 for approval and then formally adopted at MEPC 73, it could enter into force as soon as March 1, 2020.

There are already some safeguards in place to prevent ships from taking on bunkers above 0.5% sulphur post 1 January 2020. Already today, a ship has to identify in its International Air Pollution Prevention Certificate whether it uses compliant fuel oil or has an approved equivalent arrangement (e.g. a scrubber). And from 1 January 2019, amendments to appendix V of MARPOL Annex VI regarding information to be included in the bunker delivery note (BDN) requires suppliers to obtain a notification from the purchaser that fuel oil exceeding 0.5% sulphur is intended for use only in combination with an equivalent means of compliance or that the ship has a relevant exemption to conduct trials of \$0.00 emission reduction technology.

The question is whether most IMO member states believe the existing regulatory framework is sufficient to ensure that ships comply with the applicable sulphur limits, or whether they believe it is necessary to enhance the ability of PSCOs to take action against non-compliance occurring in international waters, which is currently the responsibility of the flag State.

If a HSFO carriage ban is agreed on, there are other considerations too. EGCS is not the only technology solution; other technology solutions may emerge that involves either blending HSFO with very low sulphur fuels onboard, or ship-based desulphurisation. In fact, one company has informed IBIA that it is developing a ship-based desulphurisation unit. Ships with such alternative technologies would need to be exempt from a HSFO carriage ban, but would perhaps need to demonstrate that the fuel entering the engine meets applicable the limit, or demonstrate compliance by measuring its SOx emissions.

n a historic first for the ship classification industry, DNV GL has commenced the roll out of IMO compliant electronic class and statutory certificates across its entire fleet. The widespread use of electronic certificates will result in significant efficiency gains for ship owners, charterers, regulators and crew, cutting down administrative burdens, processing time and document handling costs.

For the past few years, DNV GL has been working on pilot projects with several owners and flag administrations, to test and gain acceptance for the use of electronic certificates. This has resulted in almost 50 flag state administrations already having granted DNV GL the authority to issue electronic statutory certificates on their behalf, with more acceptances expected in the near future.

"The electronic certificate regime offered by DNV GL has provided us with a unique advantage in the contemporary market, where leverage from digitalized high-end efficient work processes plays an integral role," says Morten Nygaard, Fleet Manager, Teekay Offshore, owners of one of the vessels used in the pilot projects. Teekay Offshore is also looking to move their fleet to electronic class and statutory certificates as soon as possible: "It is our intention to benefit from the new regime within the shortest possible time frames," he added.

PRIME MINISTER INAUGURATES INDIA'S FIRST RO-RO FERRY PROJECT IN GUJARAT

ssar Projects, which is the principal EPC contractor for India's first Ro-Ro ferry project that was inaugurated here by Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, congratulated the Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) on reaching the milestone

A GMB project of national significance, the RoRo ferry will bring down the travel time between Gujarat's Gogha and Dahej Ports which are 340 km apart - from 7 hours to just 2.5 hours (inclusive of the time taken to drive from Bharuch to Dahej Port and from Gogha Port to Bhavnagar). The Ro-Ro ferry service will be able to carry about 500 passengers and 100-150 vehicles on each trip across the Gulf of Khambhat (also called Gulf of Cambay) over a 30-km (17 nautical miles) navigational channel created on the sea. Once services commence, the ferry is expected to do four round trips every day.

Scope of EPC contract awarded to Essar Projects

GMB awarded the contract for constructing the Ro-Ro terminals and supporting onshore infrastructure at Dahe, and Ghogha to Essar Projects following a competitive bidding process. The Essar Projects team has not only designed and constructed the Ro-Ro terminals at both ports, but also built the approach bunds, trestles, pontoons and link spans. The pontoon, which is a floating

structure, will facilitate traffic and passenger movement to and from the ferry vessel.

At 96 metre, the link span bridge, which connects the pontoon and jetty, is the world's longest.

Essar Projects' technical expertise was demonstrated in the reclamation work that needed to be undertaken for constructing the approach bunds. The most unique aspect of the terminal project lies in the fact that it has been executed in waters that are characterised by 10-metre-high tidal variations, which is the highest anywhere in India and the second highest in the world. Essar Projects has invested more than 8 million man hours to the project and executed it with zero LTI (Loss Time Injury).

IMO REFUTES CRITICISM OF ITS EFFORTS

MO secretary-general Kitack Lim has been moved to issue a statement reiterating that the International Maritime Organization is a transparent and inclusive body, which has been working for decades to reduce harmful air emissions from ships.

These efforts continue with this week's second meeting of the Inter-sessional Working Group on Reduction of GHG Emissions from Ships, the statement points out, where 57 IMO Member States and 21 non-governmental organizations (NGOs) in consultative status are taking part.

The IMO secretary-general's intervention follows release of a report by an organisation called InfluenceMap, which claims that "the shipping industry has aggressively lobbied the UN to obstruct climate change action for shipping," and that "at the most recent IMO environmental committee meeting 31% of nations were

represented in part by direct business interests."

"Recent media reports have questioned the transparent, inclusive approach adopted by all stakeholders with an interest in addressing the threat of climate change through the IMO," begins the IMO statement.

Lim goes on to emphasise that "as is the case in other UN agencies of a technical nature, the make-up of national delegations to IMO is entirely a matter for the countries themselves".

Furthermore, IMO currently has consultative arrangements with a total of 77 different NGOs representing a broad spectrum of interests and many different viewpoints, he adds.

With Member States responsible for selecting these NGOs, "this inclusiveness is one of IMO's great strengths", concludes Lim.

CHITTAGONG RECYCLING YARD GETS HONG KONG CONVENTION SOC

PHP Family, a recycling yard in Chittagong, Bangladesh has received a Statement of Compliance (SOC) with the Hong Kong Convention (HKC) for the safe and environmentally sound ship recycling.

Granted by international classification society RINA, the SOC is an important development towards a more sustainable ship recycling industry, further raising the bar in the standards for this sector in Bangladesh, according to GMS, a cash buyer of ships for recycling.

"PHP Family yard has worked hard to improve their safety and environmental standards by following successfully the HKC guidelines, which are enabling the whole ship recycling industry to achieve sustainable goals for ship recycling," Anil Sharma, President and CEO of GMS, said.

"We sincerely hope that this great achievement will attract more shipowners to yards that are endorsing Responsible Ship Recycling and lead as an example for the rest in Bangladesh," Sharma added. Additionally, a decision is awaited for the yards that are outside the EU and have applied for inclusion in the EU approved list of recycling facilities.

Nikos Mikelis, Non-Executive Director of GMS, said that these yards are already holding Statements of Compliance with the HKC "so they have proven that they meet the high safety and environmental standards laid out in the HKC through significant investment, training and development within the region."

"Excluding these yards would create an insurmountable divide within the industry based solely on their geographic location, and threaten to halt the positive progress made by the HKC in South Asia," Mikelis added.

At the moment, there are over 45 recycling yards in Alang, India that have received a SOC with HKC from international class societies, and another 15 yards working towards it, which means that almost 50% of the active recycling facilities in India have met the standards set by the HKC guidelines.

IRISL FLEET EXPECTED TO GROW 50% IN 2018 WITH ADDITION OF 10 VESSELS

he Islamic Republic of Iran Shipping Lines (IRISL) plans to replace 49 ships with new ones within five years, the Technical and Commercial Director of the State-run company said recently.

"The company is restoring its pre-sanctions position," said Amirsaman Torabizadeh. He explains that besides domestic capacities, IRISL will cooperate with foreign shippullding companies to materialize the plan.

Under a \$650-million contract signed last December with IRISL, the world's largest shipbuilding company Hyundai Heavy Industries (HHI) is to build four 14,400 TEU container ships and six 50,000 DWT product tankers.

Ahmad Shahbaz-Beigi, the Deputy Head of IRISL Group, said the fleet capacity of the shipping company is expected to grow 50% in 2018 with the addition of 10 vessels it has ordered from HHI.

Finance from S. Korean & Chinese Torabizadeh said Chinese and South Korean letters of credit will be used to finance the new vessels it has ordered.

Iran signed its biggest credit line deal in recent years with South Korea's Export-Import Bank in August. The deal envisages as much as Euro 8 billion in loans provided by South Korean companies to finance various projects in Iran.

Another agreement was also signed between China's CITIC Trust and five Iranian banks in Beijing earlier this month for the company to extend a credit line worth \$10 billion for supporting projects in Iran.

IRISL Chief Executive Mohammad Saeedi recently said the company has finalized \$500 million in foreign finance for purchasing ships. "The total value of the finance deal is about \$700 million while about \$500 million of the required funds will be provided by South Korean banks," he told.

Torabizadeh said the first new vessels will be imported during the first three months of 2018, expressing hope that the new ships will help the company reclaim its share in international logistics market. He also announced that IRISL will launch a container shipping line from Asia to Europe and vice versa.


JNCH LAUNCHES "REFUND SMS SEVA" TO IMPROVE TRANSPARENCY

The recent Public Notice No 133/2017 of JNCH states, "in order to make use of this facility, it is essential that refund claim should also include the mobile number and email id of the claimant/authorized person so that they will be intimated the

status of their refund claim. Hence, it is requested that mobile number and functional email id should be submitted along with refund claims."

WRECK REMOVAL - TIME TO SAVE THE ENVIRONMENT

Maritime industry today has grown leaps and bounds. With technological developments and hiked safety systems, the number of accidents and casualties have definitely been curbed. On the B-side, the estimated number of shipwrecks have increased, posing a threat to the industry.

Ship wrecks in simple terms means badly destroyed or damaged ship at sea or on shore. Post accidents, some vessels are restored, salvaged and brought back to life. But in some situations, her salvation and recovery becomes non-feasible, and that is when she becomes a wreck. Such wrecks over a period of time pose threat to the environment and is a hazard to navigation. Subsequent removal of wrecks is thus important.

Wreck removals usually require the mobilisation of some of the heaviest units in the world salvage fleet, including floating sheerleg and cranes, pull barges and a vast array of specialised equipment. Throughout the process of wreck removal, environmental risks is a major concern. It must be ensured that on completion of the main work, the sea bottom is cleaned and marine flora is re-planted. Container ships make for expensive wrecks. Due to technological advancements, the ability to remove potential pollutants from a wreck lying in deep water is possible thus making the whole process expensive.

The process of removing wreck is not an easy task. The cost of removal from either coastline or from deeper water is great. The potential cost drivers of wreck removal are:

- *Location of wreck
- ·Cargo recovery from ships
- ·Nature of bunker fuel removal operations
- ·Contractual arrangements
- ·Influence of government authorities

Having said all this, hasn't the thought of having to bear the cost of wreck removal creeped into your mind? To answer the question, the cost is indemnified by a 3rd party liability underwriter i.e. the P&I Clubs.

The tolerance today towards wrecks is next to nil by the politicians, public & environment groups. Even if a wreck does not pose any threat to the environment, the media



through its highlight, forces the owners to take action.

The Coastal State Authorities and other legal frameworks collectively regulate the process of wreck removal. Since coastal states form legal framework, political authorities tend to exercise their power and influence the operations. This could also be the reason for differences in jurisdiction and difficulty in enforcing law.

IMO recognized this inconsistency in regulations and adopted the Nairobi Convention in 2007. The objective of this convention is 'To harmonize acceded states' attitudes to wrecks & to give more commonality to decision-making about whether wrecks should be removed.'

The process of wreck removal is generally handed down to a contractor. The ship-owner, as a first process, invites tender for removal. Interested contractors then apply after thorough analysis of the condition. The contractors then devise a removal plan that is best suited for the wreck. Consequently the wreck is removed and the cargo is handled accordingly.

This whole process of wreck removal might seem tedious to some ship-owners. But it would definitely reverse the hazard it could cause to the environment in the near future. It is hoped that every Coastal State Authority ratifies this Nairobi Convention and puts it to their best use, all for the sake of the environment.

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
